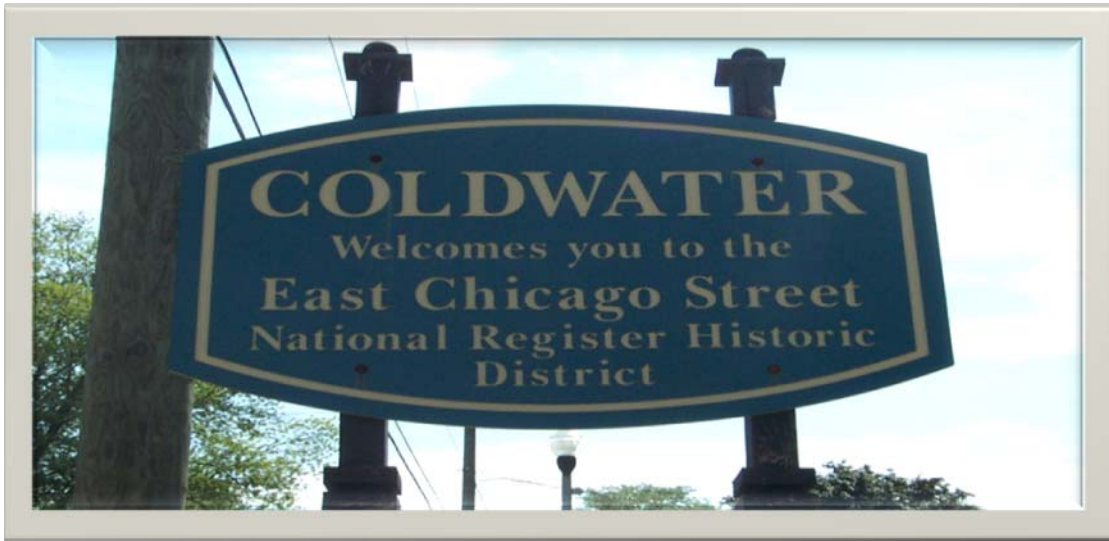


What is in and around Coldwater, MI

Coldwater lies in southern central Michigan just 12 miles north of the Indiana/Michigan State lines at the intersections of Interstate 69 and US-12 and is approximately 25 miles by road to the northwest corner of Ohio.

While driving in and around Coldwater one can view some very big and beautiful old homes, an old time downtown area with vintage stores and yet very quickly be out in farming country or around a lot of lakes.



To the east you have towns like Quincy and Allen that are known for their Antique shops and a 3/8 mile high bank dirt oval race track, called Butler Motor Speedway. Somewhere around Quincy is an old time steam engine train ride. If you continue east on US-12 far enough you will get into the Irish Hills and go by the Michigan International Speedway.

To the west on US-12 you can travel one of Michigan's scenic/historic routes that actually goes through many small towns and grape growing country. US-12 goes all the way from Detroit, MI to Chicago, IL and was a major route before the day of expressways and Interstate Highways.

To the north on I-69 just north of I-94 you will find a quaint little Farm/Restaurant called "Turkeyville". To the west on I-94 a short distance is the Firekeepers Casino and then Battlecreek the home of Kellogg's Breakfast cereals.

To the south you get into Indiana's North Country, lots of lakes and Pokagon State Park just north of Angola, Indiana. To the east of Angola is a lot of farm country and Steuben County Speedway a 3/8 mile asphalt race track. To the west of Angola are more lakes, farms, Amish Country, Shipshewana, road apples and lots of good cooking.
